## 2021 Grant Funding

Captain Planet <u>ecoSolution Grant</u> — Support intends to provide solution-oriented, youth-led projects that result in real environmental outcomes. Cycle 1 opens September 15 and closes January 15, 2021. Cycle 2 opens March 15 and closes July 15, 2021.

NFWF <u>Five Star and Urban Waters Restoration Grant Program</u> — The Five Star and Urban Waters Restoration grant program seeks to develop community capacity to sustain local natural resources for future generations by providing modest financial assistance to diverse local partnerships focused on improving water quality, watersheds and the species and habitats they support. The deadline is **January 28, 2021**.

FEMA Fiscal Year 2020 <u>Hazard Mitigation Assistance Grants</u> — This notice covers FEMA's application period for the Fiscal Year 2020 (FY20) Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) Notices of Funding Opportunities (NOFOs) for the Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) grant program and the new Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) pre-disaster mitigation grant programs. FEMA's two competitive mitigation grant programs provide states, local communities, tribes and territories (SLTTs) funding for eligible mitigation activities to strengthen our nation's ability to build a culture of preparedness by reducing disaster losses and protecting life and property from future disaster damages. The deadline is **January 29, 2021**.

Captain Planet <u>Project Learning Garden</u> — Support intends to provide solution-oriented, youth-led projects that result in real environmental outcomes. Cycle 1 opens September 5th and closes **January 31, 2021**.

Institute of Museum and Library Services <u>Museum Assessment Program (MAP)</u> — It is designed to <u>help museums assess their strengths and weaknesses</u>, and plan for the future. The deadline is **February 1**, **2021**.

<u>American Honda Foundation</u> — Grant making that supports youth education with a specific focus on the STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) subjects in addition to the environment. Application deadlines are four times a year: **February 1**, **May 1**, **August 1**, **and November 1**.

Clif Bar Family Foundation <u>Small Grants</u> — Funding priorities include: Protect Earth's beauty and bounty; Create a robust, healthy food system; Increase opportunities for outdoor activity; Reduce environmental health hazards; and Build stronger communities. Application deadlines are three time a year: **February 1st, June 1st, and October 1st.** 

NFWF <u>Longleaf Landscape Stewardship Fund 2021 Request for Proposals</u> — Proposals should expand and enhance longleaf pine ecosystem restoration and management across longleaf pine's historical range, as well as the restoration and enhancement of bottomland hardwood forests within priority focal areas. The deadline is **February 4, 2020.** 

BAA <u>Pollution Prevention & Mitigation BAA</u> — This Broad Agency Announcement (BAA) seeks opportunities to co-create, co-design, co-invest, and collaborate in the research, development, piloting, and scaling of innovative interventions for effectively mitigating air, water, and soil pollution, including

ocean plastic pollution, electronic and other forms of solid waste in low and middle-income countries (LMICs). The deadline is **February 5, 2021**.

NOAA NOS FY2021 Marine Debris Research — Funding supports eligible organizations to conduct research directly related to marine debris through field, laboratory, and modeling experiments. The deadline is **February 8, 2021**.

NSF Improving Undergraduate STEM Education: Hispanic-Serving Institutions — The goals of the HSI program are to enhance the quality of undergraduate science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education and to increase the recruitment, retention, and graduation rates of students pursuing associates or baccalaureate degrees in STEM. The deadline is **February 10, 2021**.

NOAA Fisheries <u>Gulf of Mexico Bay Watershed Education and Training (Gulf B-WET) Program</u> — The program funds locally relevant, authentic experiential learning for K-12 audiences through Meaningful Watershed Educational Experiences (MWEEs). MWEEs are multi-stage activities that include learning both outdoors and in the classroom and aim to increase understanding and stewardship of watersheds and related ocean, coastal, riverine, and estuarine ecosystems. New for FY21 includes to support meaningful responses to the COVID-19 pandemic including creative and alternative approaches to watershed education, especially in marginalized groups, particularly students of color and students from low-income families, that are more likely to lose environmental education within their local school districts. The deadline is **February 26, 2021**.

Mohamed bin Zayed Species Conservation Fund — Grants of up to \$25,000 will be awarded in support of plant, animal, and fungi species conservation efforts without discrimination on the basis of region or selected species. The deadlines are three times a year: **February 28**, **June 30**, **and October 31**.

NEA Foundation <u>Learning & Leadership Grants</u> — Awards to NEA members for individual or group STEM K-12 associated needs. The next application period is December 2 through **February 28, 2021**.

<u>Interconnection Nonprofit Grants</u> — Computer grants are awarded to organizations that deliver necessary and valuable services to underserved communities like technology training, health care, education, and job training, but need upgraded computers to better manage their organization and improve their capacity to deliver those valuable services. The deadlines are **February 28**, **May 31**, **August 31**, **and November 30**.

Dr. Scholl Foundation <u>Annual Grant Cycle</u> — Applications are considered for education, social service, healthcare, civic and cultural, and environmental categories. Applications are accepted between **October 1st** with the **deadline March 1**.

Toshiba America <u>Grants for Grades 6-12</u> — Teachers may apply for up to \$5,000 for innovative STEM teaching ideas. The deadlines are **March 1**, **June 1**, **September 1**, **and December 1**. Gannett Foundation <u>Media Grants</u> — The Gannett Foundation invests in the future of the media industry by supporting journalism education and training programs with particular interest in program or projects that seek to encourage diversity in newsrooms and in coverage. The deadlines are **March 1** and **October 1** of each year.

New Louisiana Sea Grant <u>FY2022-2023 Competitive Research Program Request for Proposals</u> — This is the omnibus competitive research cycle. The **statement of interest is due March 8, 2021 and full proposals are due June 4, 2021.** 

NOAA Addressing the Impacts of Multiple Stressors on Shellfish Aquaculture through Research/Industry Partnerships — Applications to this competition should utilize new or existing research/industry partnerships to study how ocean and coastal acidification in combination with other stressors impacts shellfish aquaculture. The deadline is **March 16, 2021**.

<u>Kleberg Foundation Grants</u> — The Foundation's primary funding interests include arts and humanities, with a focus on supporting the visual arts through funding of exhibitions of the highest caliber at established museums, with the intent to broaden audiences; and, wildlife, conservation, and animal sciences, with a particular interest in research focusing on maintaining the integrity of ecosystems, including native plant establishment, understanding important stopover habitats of Nearctic-Neotropical migratory birds, and investigations of endangered or sensitive species endemic to the **south Texas region**. Grant deadlines are Spring: **February 1 – March 31 and Fall: August 1 – September 30.** 

The Lawrence Foundation <u>Grants</u> — This private family foundation is focused on making grants to support environmental, education, human services and other causes. The proposal deadlines are twice a year, **April 30 and November 1.** 

The Max and Victoria Dreyfus Foundation <u>Grants</u> — The Foundation will consider requests to support museums, cultural, and performing arts programs; schools, hospitals, educational and skills training programs, programs for youth, seniors, and the handicapped; environmental and wildlife protection activities; and other community-based organizations and their programs. A letter of inquiry is required. The deadline is November 10th and **May 10th** of each year.

FWS <u>Endangered Species Recovery Implementation</u> — The principal objective of this Recovery Implementation funding opportunity is to support the implementation of priority recovery actions for federally endangered and threatened species. The deadline is **September 30, 2021**.
