Animal Health Alert – Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC) has put out an alert for "Mange Mites" which according to TAHC are preventable. Mange mites commonly found in cattle is the Chorioptes bovis (C. bovis). Symptoms: they live on the skin feeding on shedding skin cells. Visible abrasions/lesions caused from feeding on the animal's skin become contaminated. If you suspect your cattle have mange mites contact your local veterinarian. New technology finds its way into the ear of replacement cattle.



The Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC) has a limited number of Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) ear tags. The RFID tags are to be used as an alternative to silver metal Brite tags and orange

metal Official Calfhood Vaccination (OCV) tags. RFID devices provide state animal health officials and the cattle industries increased ability to accurately and quickly trace animals exposed to or infected with potentially devastating diseases before they can do substantial damage to the U.S. livestock and consumer markets.

2% Sodium Hypochlorite Active Ingredient	3 teaspoons	1 cup
3% Sodium Hypochlorite Active Ingredient	2 teaspoons	1 cup
4% Sodium Hypochlorite Active Ingredient	1 1/2 teaspoons	1 cup
5% Sodium Hypochlorite Active Ingredient	1 1/4 teaspoon	1 cup
6-7% Sodium Hypochlorite Active Ingredient	1 teaspoon	1 cup
8-10% Sodium Hypochlorite Active Ingredient	3/4 teaspoon	1 cup
